

Job Description: Head of Science

Reports to: Vice Principal

The Role

Reporting to the Vice Principal, the Head of Department is responsible for developing and leading a rigorous curriculum which enables the highest level of pupil progress and attainment.

As HoD Science you will take responsibility and be accountable for the outcomes of GCSE Combined Science, Triple Science and BTEC Professional pathways - you will drive ambitious outcomes to ensure exceptional performance.

Elvin's Science Department secured its best ever outcomes in 2024 – and we are expecting even more in 2025!

The role involves managing the professional community of Science teachers and technicians to ensure high attainment and to develop a love of learning in all pupils.

The Head of Science will be a member of a strong middle leadership team, making a significant contribution to the quality of learning and teaching across the academy, supporting our school improvement.

Key responsibilities

The full remit of the post will be negotiated dependent on the skills and experience of the candidate appointed. Specific responsibilities are subject to change.

The Subject Leader will take responsibility for the following specific roles within their wider role as a middle leader of the school:

- Coordinate a 7-year Science curriculum across the Academy
- Embed an Ark aligned Science curriculum across all key stages which will include attendance at key Science Mastery meetings and training
- Lead the professional community of Science teachers
- Be an excellent manager of the Science leadership team
- Develop Teachers at all levels including the coaching of trainees
- Plan, resource and teach Science lessons and sequences of lessons to the highest standard that ensure real learning takes place and pupils make excellent progress
- Provide a nurturing classroom and academy environment that helps pupils to develop as learners

- Help to maintain discipline across the whole academy
- Contribute to the effective working of the academy

Academy Culture

- To support the academy's values and ethos by contributing to the development and implementation of policies, practices and procedures
- To help create a strong academy community, characterised by consistent, orderly behaviour and caring, respectful relationships
