Teaching Assistant: Job Description



The Role

We are seeking a dedicated and compassionate Teaching Assistant to provide high-quality 1:1 support for a pupil with additional learning needs, as well as supporting children more broadly where appropriate. In this role, you will work closely with the class teacher and wider school team to help create a positive, inclusive, and supportive learning environment. Your primary responsibility will be to deliver tailored support that meets the individual

needs of a pupil, helping them to access the curriculum, develop confidence, and achieve their full potential both academically and socially.

Key Responsibilities

Learning Support

- Provide high-quality 1:1 support for children in the primary setting, including the Early Years, with a range of special educational needs and disabilities, including complex physical needs.
- Promote inclusion, encouraging children to interact, play, and work collaboratively with peers.
- Work with the SENDCo and class teacher to assess individual needs, contribute to and implement Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs) and Individual Support Plans.
- Adapt and develop resources and activities to enable access to the Early Years curriculum, ensuring children's safety and engagement.
- Assist with follow-through from external professionals (physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and language therapy, etc.).
- Support the development of communication, independence, and confidence in daily routines and play.
- Observe, record, and feedback information on children's progress and well-being.
- Use agreed strategies, in liaison with the teacher, to assist with behaviour management and to support learning objectives.



















- Encourage and support children's social, emotional, and physical development through structured and child-initiated play.
- Prepare and maintain specialist equipment (e.g. communication aids, adapted seating) and learning spaces to meet children's individual needs.

Medical and Intimate Care

- Follow children's medical and intimate care plans, including:
 - Nappy changing and toileting support.
 - Catheterisation and other agreed medical procedures (training provided).
 - Safe moving and handling, including the use of wheelchairs and mobility aids
- Administer medication and carry out specific health interventions in line with school policy and training.
- Maintain dignity, privacy, and safeguarding standards at all times.

Support for the school

- Supervise pupils during playtimes, lunchtimes, and on school trips, ensuring their health, safety, and inclusion.
- Assist with the preparation of displays, resources, and classroom organisation.
- Contribute to the wider Early Years and school environment, supporting positive behaviour and a nurturing ethos.

Other

- Actively promote the safety and welfare of all children and young people.
- Ensure compliance with the school's data protection rules and procedures.
- Liaise with colleagues, parents/carers, and external professionals with confidence, tact, and diplomacy.
- Contribute to a workplace culture which has safeguarding and child protection at its heart.
- Undertake any other reasonable tasks as directed by the SENDCo, class teacher, or senior leadership.

- GCSE Maths and English Grade C or above (or equiv)
- Recognised Teaching Assistant or Early Years qualification.
- Willingness to undertake specialist training (e.g. moving & handling, catheterisation, paediatric first aid).

Experience of supporting young children, ideally in an Early Years or primary setting.

- Experience of providing personal and intimate care with sensitivity and professionalism.
- Knowledge of strategies to support communication and physical needs, including use of specialist equipment.
- Good literacy, numeracy, organisational and IT skills.
- Ability to observe, assess and record children's progress and share information effectively.
- Strong communication and interpersonal skills with children, families, and colleagues.
- Ability to follow medical protocols and respond calmly in emergencies
